My dream in life is to be a leading photographer who can travel the world to meet new people, work with new clients including celebrities and all other people. I am grateful to Mfesane and all the people that made this dream possible. The equipment I received today will put me in a position to make my dream a reality".

The 10 entrepreneurs completed a one year, full-time, entrepreneurial programme comprising training in: Basic Entrepreneurial Skills, Special Tracksuit-making Course, Tax Turnover Training, Job Readiness, Workshop, Beadwork Training, Small Business Venture Workshop, Business Concept Mentorship, Business Counselling, Marketing and Branding and Mobile Literacy.

This job creation grant-funding partnership between West Coast based civil society organisation, Mfesane NPC, and poverty eradication agency, National Development Agency (NDA) has to date produced 30 youth start-up businesses in the Western Province – 10 are based in Khayelitsha. The programme facilitated by Mfesane received a grant of R368 883.69 from the NDA to provide the business training workshops and supply start-up kits for the 10 self-motivated entrepreneurs.

"Mfesane's vision and mission of 'empowered communities, sustainable families' is realised through this partnership with the NDA. I wish all the participants well in establishing their businesses. They can only grow from here as they have already demonstrated their determination and will to succeed through participation in the programme" says Mrs Yolandi Afrika, Chief Executive Officer of Mfesane NPC.

"Unemployment is a key driver of poverty in our country. The NDA has a deliberate strategy that seeks to narrow the unemployment rate, particularly amongst young people and other vulnerable groups within communities. Together with Mfesane, we have moved this group of women from a position of unemployment to being able to start their own businesses and start to enjoy income generation opportunities that come with being self-employed.
